

My PSE&G Bills are high, what can I do?

The first thing you should do is contact TeamWalker and, if you meet income eligibility requirements we can help for FREE, starting with an energy audit of your home.

What is an Energy Audit?

An energy audit is a means of examining your entire home to see if hot or cool air is leaking out through improperly sealed windows and doors or through a poorly insulated attic. Your furnace or boiler, domestic water heater and your stove are also checked to see if they are working properly and efficiently. Carbon Monoxide levels and possible gas leaks are also evaluated.

How is it done?

An appointment will be made with a trained technician who will come to your home and conduct an energy audit as described above. The technician will check your heating system and water heater first, then the stove. Then a blower door device will be setup and the home will be inspected for air leakage. After all measurements and information have been gathered, the technician will enter the data into a computer audit program. The audit program will suggest the necessary adjustments needed to make your home more energy efficient and comfortable.

Then what happens?

You will receive a phone call about the results and a date will be scheduled to come out and make the necessary repairs to make your home more energy efficient.

What kind of repairs?

Depending upon the results of the audit, repairs might include:

Installation of weather-stripping and/or caulking around doors and windows, attic insulation and basement perimeters, along with other minor repairs to ensure optimum energy efficiency

Can the Weatherization Assistance Program do anything about heating systems?

Yes, clients who are income eligible may have a furnace or boiler replaced, if this is deemed necessary.
